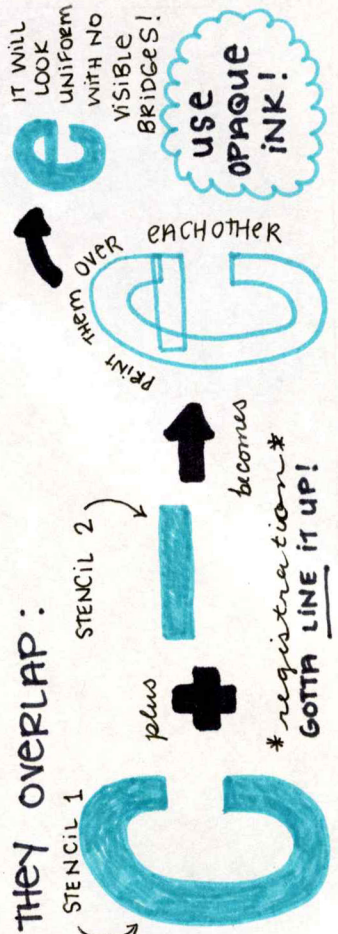


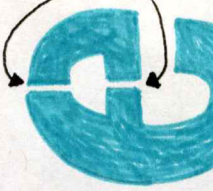
IF YOU DON'T WANT THE LIL' BRIDGES TO SHOW IN YOUR FINAL PRINT,

YOU CAN MAKE TWO STENCILS AND PRINT THEM IN THE SAME COLOR SO

THEY OVERLAP:

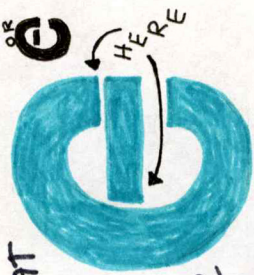


YOU CAN BUILD SOME OBVIOUS BRIDGES IF YOU LIKE



THE STENCIL LOOK COOL

OR YOU CAN TRY TO HIDE THEM BY BUILDING BRIDGES THAT FLOW WITH YOUR DESIGN A LITTLE MORE

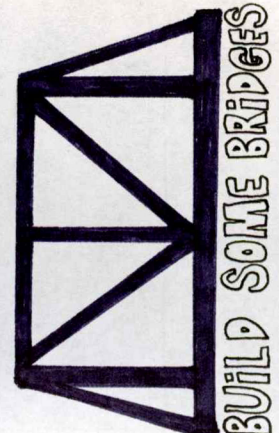


IT IS IMPORTANT TO THINK ABOUT



OR → oh

WITHOUT BRIDGES, ISLANDS DISAPPEAR



PRINTING OPTIONS

APPLICATOR

you'll need:

- YOUR STENCILS
- INK OR PAINT
- AN APPLICATOR

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

know you apply the ink or paint through the stencil.

MY FAVE: MAKE-UP SPONGES WORK SUPER WELL!

OR FOAM BRUSHES ALSO WORK WELL.

BUT YOU CAN ALSO USE PAPER TOWELS, KITCHEN SPONGES, RAGS, ALMOST ANYTHING!

SOMETIMES PEOPLE USE STENCIL BRUSHES.

NOTICE THE FLAT TOP - STENCIL BRUSH

A THIMBON?? I MEAN! I GUESS.

INK

OR

VERY LIQUIDY INKS/PRINTS ARE HARDER TO WORK WITH.

IT'S BEST TO SLOWLY BUILD UP THINNER LAYERS OF INK / PAINT.

TYPICALLY YOU SHOULD PRINT LAYERS FROM THE LIGHTEST & MOST TRANSPARENT TO DARKEST & MOST OPAQUE.

you could even use NAIL POLISH!

- ## DON'T BE AFRAID to play around
- TRY BLENDING COLORS USING THE SAME STENCIL
 - USE BOTH POSITIVE & NEGATIVE STENCILS
 - PRINT ON DIFFERENT PAPERS OR EVEN ON WOOD OR METAL
 - TRY PRINTING ON A CURVED SURFACE
 - PRINT ON TOP OF PHOTOGRAPHS OR MAPS
- don't limit yourself! have fun!
